Utah Covid News

The number of new cases of COVID-19 reported in Utah continues to be a fraction of what it was a month ago. Currently no counties in the state have a high risk COVID-19 community level, but the CDC still suggests wearing masks for people who are immunocompromised, at high risk, or if have contact with someone who is high risk

Vaccines

The CDC, so far, isn't recommending a fourth shot for the general public. The current guidance suggests a booster shot 5 months after the second dose of Pfizer or Moderna. To read more about vaccine recommendations click the link below. CDC vaccine recommendations

Variants

BA.2 is still growing and will eventually be the dominant variant. The good news is a new study shows that previous infection with the widely circulating BA.1 version of the Omicron coronavirus variant provides strong protection against its relative BA.2. The results suggest that BA.2 is unlikely to cause a major wave of infections in communities that have experienced a BA.1 wave.

Lab tests have also suggested the BA.2 variant is more infectious and has more severe symptoms for unvaccinated. BA.2 Subvariant Study
